When we were in Boulder, Colorado recently, we met a longtime friend who is the pastor at First UMC there in Boulder. We arrived early so we had a great time wondering through the downtown area, stopping in shops, and enjoying the beautiful scenery.

Diane had read about something unique regarding the church, so we also took a walk around the building to find this special highlight. Etched into the side of what used to be the main entrance is a face sculpted into the wall. The face is young and innocent looking. If you didn't know the story, one might presume that this image is that of an angel. And perhaps it is in one way. But it is also much more.

In 1891, when the church was being built, one of the stonemason's young daughters became very ill. She died before the completion of the church. So, to honor her memory, the mason carved an image of his daughter into the stonework of the church. Though the carving has eroded with time, it is still possible to see this tribute preserved in the church.

I suspect most people walk by, unaware of this angelic presence in their midst. But for those who know where to look she is there to provide a kind welcome, and a reminder of a love lost much too soon.

To the best of my knowledge, there are no such tributes at First UMC Columbus. But as I walk around the building, I am often reminded of those who have left their mark upon this church and this community. Their memory fills me with love and appreciation. I could begin to name them, but I wouldn't know where to stop. They are many. And I am grateful for them.

It isn't just churches. All around us are reminders of those we have loved. These are pleasant reminders of the lives they lived and the impact they made upon us all. May those angels smile upon us all and fill our hearts with good memories.


Destination unknown!


Book Club


New in the Church Library

It is hard to believe that June is already here. This time last year I was in transition with moving here to Columbus and looking forward to getting to know all of you. Thank you for your hospitality throughout this year.

Thank you for your words of encouragement and support since it was announced that I am moving to the New York area and that I will be closer to family and friends.

Our journeys do begin with small steps at first. We rely on those around us for love and support as we begin life and start making decisions as to which way we are going to go. We have to decide which direction we are going to go in and listen carefully where God is calling us. The arrows seem to pop up when we least expect them to at times. We might think that the current path we are on is the one we are supposed to be on for years at a time, but that is not always the case. Twists and turns do happen along the journey that can take us on some interesting adventures. Along our journey we have opportunities to enjoy beautiful scenery and landscapes.
