Dear Friends,

A friend and colleague did a pulpit exchange with a pastor from England. For two months in England, he preached at the church, made hospital calls, visited parishioners, etc. The pastor from England did the same here.

Upon arriving in England, my friend was exhausted. He decided to take a nap. And he overslept. When he awoke, he was remembered that he was to lead a worship service at the church that evening. He frantically grabbed his robe and sermon notes and raced out the door. He sped to the church and arrived only a few minutes late.

Inside, a lay member welcomed him. My friend apologized for his lateness and prepared to enter and begin the service. The wise lay member stopped him. First, take a moment to collect yourself. They went into the study and sat down for a moment. For having raced to the church, it was a good opportunity for my friend prepare himself emotionally, physically, and spiritually for the task at hand. After sitting together and having a gentle conversation, the lay member offered a prayer. Then they went into the sanctuary and began the worship service.

The service was a few minutes late, but people seemed very understanding. My friend benefitted from the chance to collect his thoughts rather than continuing to race into the worship service.

I was remembering that story in light of the preparations for Christmas. In our staff meetings we have already begun preparing and working on the services and events that will make this an inspiring and meaningful season.

Whether we are ready or not, December 25th will be here soon. In the weeks ahead we will likely experience higher stress levels because of all there is to do to get ready. But along the way, I want to offer a small piece of advice. Go slowly. Be patient with yourself. Take a rest when you need. When the decorations are done, take a moment to be still and admire the beauty. Whether you adorn your house like Chevy Chase in "Christmas Vacation" or you put a few simple decorations around the house. Stop to enjoy the beauty. If a Christmas tune comes on the radio, take a moment to really enjoy it. Sing along if you'd like (even if you're in Target.) If you send Christmas cards, take a moment to give thanks for the friends and loved ones. Throughout this season, find opportunities to slow down, even stop, to appreciate the steps that lead to a holy Christmas.


Book Club
