

Mountain Mission Truck



- 25 members attended and one guest was invited
- Stephanie opened with a prayer
- An explanation sheet about UWF membership and pledge info for the active circle members was discussed. The distribution of the pledge funds was explained and another paper listed the mission giving of our Cheer Fund Monies.
- Treasury Report-\$1260 in pledges
- Minutes of the September minutes were approved.
- Fundraiser- Sheryl Nulph reported that Texas Roadhouse has several options for fundraising. Applebee's will donate 10% of a dining night if addressed as a fundraiser. Suggestion was made to check out the Hot Box Pizza program. Sheryl asked for volunteers who would help her with this endeavor to meet with her after the meeting. Subject tabled to next month.
- Stephanie listed the sign up sheets that were on the front table. She asked us to update our information for a UWF directory.
- Cathy Custer explained how the church handles requests for funeral dinners and asked volunteers to list their name and phone number.

- Jeri reported that an additional \$1 was added to the pledge request this year as an assembly asking donation because the 2026 Assembly will be in Indianapolis.

- Donna began the worship by asking us about the number of Bibles we own personally. She talked about the UMC distribution program for 3rd-4th graders and the one she received at her high school graduation. She named the 5 Bibles she currently uses and asked how many of us had learned Bible verses when we were younger. She closed with a prayer.
- Stephanie presented a program she titled "4 Powerful God Truths We Can Learn from a Pumpkin" which she took from the book "A Pumpkin Patch Parable" by Liz Curtis Hicks. This is the summary of each of the parables: 1. We all begin as seeds where God places us and helps us develop 2. We are all different but we are beautiful and good because God made us. 3. Just like we must remove the insides of the pumpkin, God must cleanse us and gets rid of our sins as we are forgiven. 4. Just like the jack-o-lanterns, we must let our God light shine.
