In the book, "RealLivePreacher.com," Gordon Atkinson writes brief essays about his ministry. In one essay he writes about the overwhelming responsibilities of being a pastor. In his mind he is reflecting on all the things he needs to do. He was going to bring that Sunday School book to the person who missed class. And there was that family that was planning to move away, did he ever call them? And the woman whose mother was sick, he intended to send her a note. Is Joan still in the hospital? He meant to go by and visit. Hadn't he said he was going to set up a lunch visit with Charles sometime this week? The list goes on....

While I can relate to these sentiments, I don't think they are unique to the ordained ministry. We all face a myriad of responsibilities, expectations, and good intentions. And some things we check off the list and move on. And others are overlooked or forgotten, only to pop up again and again as a remembrance of things waiting to be done.

It can be overwhelming. It can feel frustrating. For everything we accomplish, it seems that there are several things needing to be done. The to-do list seems endless.

I would daresay that even Jesus experienced such feelings. There are times when he seems overwhelmed by the crowds and the expectations. And if he took the time to play or laugh or do something frivolous, I wonder if he felt a twinge of guilt or looked over his shoulder to make sure no one was noticing such frivolity. We are likely to experience such feelings, so I suspect Jesus did as well.

What I do notice in the midst of such high expectations is that Jesus took time to find a quiet place to pray, meditate, relax. This was important. He needed those moments. And we do too. It might be helpful to include on any to-do list a few suggestions like, "Be good to yourself" or "Take a moment to breathe deeply" or "Take a walk around the neighborhood" or any other item that brings you peace. Make a priority of caring for yourself and doing the things that bring energy and vitality to you. That is as important as any other item on your to-do list.


Columbus Indiana Pride Festival
